
During its inaugural year, the PEC definitely met the challenges of accountable care—with

A FOCUS ON CARE AND SERVICE

Early in 2013, Swedish Medical Group set a foundation of five strategic goals to guide the year's growth and planning.

The overall strategy was the same throughout Swedish Health Services and Providence Health & Services. We all were on a parallel course to monitor, measure and be held accountable for care and service in every clinic and department. SMG focused on these particular areas:

- Ensure highest quality
- Improve access
- Build relationships
- · Transition to accountable care
- · Increase operational efficiency

SMG leadership, physicians and staff made these strategic goals a part of every day's work, using them to improve patient care and safety; expand primary care hours and simplify appointment-making; improve customer service; offer value-based care; and create a system for best-in-class data collection and reporting.

We also asked our patients to complete Press Ganey surveys and tell us how we were doing and how we could change. Their comments helped us to improve and commit even more solidly to our strategic goals.

We'll modify these strategic goals for 2014 to achieve further progress in every area. The relationships with our patients and their families influence us most distinctly and support our efforts to transform healthcare delivery.

NAVIGATING A NEW HEALTHCARE LANDSCAPE

Swedish Medical Group established an Accountable Care Services department in late 2012 with the broad task of building the infrastructure and leadership needed to make accountable care a reality at Swedish. This requires creating efficiently coordinated care delivery.

Accountable care has its roots in the Institute for Healthcare Improvement's Triple Aim: 1) improving the patient experience of care (including quality and satisfaction); 2) improving the health of populations; and 3) reducing the per-capita cost of healthcare. And while SMG has long made those elements a priority, it's now responding to a wider healthcare industry shift as well as the Affordable Care Act.

There's a focus on managing the health of populations — which could be a business, a community, or patients with similar conditions. The traditional fee-for-service model is being upended and replaced with a model that instead depends on both quality of care and quality

outcomes. Patient experience is improving, with renewed emphasis on customer service, adding value to every visit, providing better access and partnering with patients.

Throughout 2013, SMG's Accountable Care Services made rapid and significant progress in key areas. The department did so by building infrastructure, training staff, identifying specific patient populations, deploying new resources, assisting with care package development and negotiating shared savings contracts.

ACO DESIGNATION ACHIEVED

SMG's accountable care work also includes vital collaboration with our parent company, Providence Health & Services, as part of The Providence and Swedish ACO of Washington. The efforts of this work came to fruition on Dec. 23, 2013, when Health and Human Services Secretary Kathleen Sibelius announced that our ACO, Health Connect Partners LLC, was selected as one of 123 new Accountable Care Organizations (ACOs) in Medicare.

CARE MANAGEMENT CHANGES

The transition to an accountable healthcare system requires new resources deployed in new ways to keep pace with patient needs. Nurses, a vital part of the care equation, are managing complex patient care. Clinical and community health professionals also are bringing their skills to Swedish Medical Group. Combined, these varied services round out a patient's care experience from clinic visit to after-care at home.

NURSES

- Care Management: Registered nurses, specifically care and complex-care managers, form the core of SMG's new care management team. They manage care services and coordination for our most complex patients during transitions from one setting to the next, whether clinical or community or home. Under their adept management, unnecessary hospitalizations and emergency department visits are decreasing. Patients are receiving care most appropriate for their health needs and life situations.
- **Readmission Management:** Patients with a diagnosis of heart failure, acute myocardial infarction or pneumonia are particularly vulnerable for avoidable hospital readmissions. SMG expanded its existing nurse-based program that provides follow-up calls to these

patients and formed a new partnership with Swedish hospital caregivers to support these efforts to keep patients well and to avoid readmissions.

NAVIGATORS

Navigators are the newest addition to SMG care teams in primary care clinics. These behavioral and social health professionals support complex care managers by managing patients' social services needs. They navigate and coordinate community resources.

IN-CLINIC PHARMACISTS

SMG brought pharmacists into two primary care clinic sites in 2013. They fill a definite patient care need by managing multiple medications and evaluating generic options. Their work focuses on easing post-discharge care transitions and decreasing unnecessary medication costs.

BUNDLED CARE PACKAGE OPTIONS

Swedish Medical Group took bold steps in 2013 to align with the Institute for Healthcare Improvement's Triple Aim of improving the patient experience of care, improving the health of populations and reducing the per-capita cost of healthcare. These steps included creating bundled care packages within major Swedish service lines.

A bundled payment is a reimbursement mechanism in which a provider offers a payer a fixed price for a group of services for a particular treatment or condition. A care package is the collection of services over a defined period of time that is covered under the bundled payment.

Both large employers and insurance plans are looking to the efficiency of bundled care packages to manage the health of their employees and customers.

SWEDISH ORTHOPEDIC INSTITUTE

The Swedish Orthopedic Institute partnered with SMG, Swedish Health Services and Providence Health & Services to develop a total joint replacement (hip and knee) surgery care package. This package spans a patient's episode of care from pre-admission to inpatient hospital stay through all post-discharge phases. The model incorporates evidence-based best practices to deliver a care experience that extends the most reliable, highest quality of care at the lowest cost to both patients and purchasers. The orthopedic care package has resulted in hospital operations efficiencies, a lower fixed cost for payers and improved quality of care.

SWEDISH HEART & VASCULAR INSTITUTE

On the heels of the orthopedic care package success, a group that included cardiac surgeons, cardiologists and clinicians from other areas of cardiac care began work on CABG/Valve Care Package products for the Swedish Heart and Vascular Institute (SHVI). This group reviewed data and processes to create a coronary artery bypass graft (CABG) and valve care package/bundle. An important component of the care package includes assessing patient satisfaction by surveying, interviewing and shadowing patients through entire episodes of care.

CONFIDENCE SETS THE TONE FOR CARE

Today's healthcare customer has a choice of where they want to receive care, so it's vital to focus on customer experience. This way patients can concentrate on what's important — their health — while we focus on exceeding their expectations.

In 2013, Swedish Medical Group began to look at customer service and patient experience through a new lens. By gathering information from stakeholder interviews, focus groups and customer data, SMG is better able to understand what a patient's primary needs are and what Swedish's strengths are in meeting them.

We discovered the reason people choose Swedish today is the same as when it opened more than 100 years ago — confidence. Swedish patients have confidence in the care they receive, the ease in which they can access care and the ongoing relationships they build with their caregivers. The ability to inspire confidence in patients is what sets Swedish apart from other healthcare organizations.

With the goal of inspiring confidence at every point in the patient's health experience, SMG launched an internal initiative aimed at engaging caregivers and building a culture of delivering an exceptional experience. This has included training, workshops and resources for clinical, support and leadership staff across every department and clinic. Equipped with five principles to guide their way, caregivers now are able to anticipate and exceed patient expectations, and we're seeing their work reflected in increased patient satisfaction scores. They are confident in themselves, in their colleagues and in the care and service they give every day.



FOCUSED EFFORTS STEER CHANGE

Swedish Medical Group's Quality Department was re-designated Quality & Value in 2013. Its mission broadened to include making Swedish a leader in providing exceptional medical care while controlling costs and increasing value.

The department works closely with SMG's Accountable Care Services team to continually improve patient quality outcomes and transition away from the traditional fee-for-service model. Managing this change effectively is central to Swedish's goal of transforming healthcare. The Quality & Value Department is led by the dyad partnership of Quality & Value medical director and the Accountable Care Services administrative director. Together they are creating a new way of understanding, measuring and delivering high-quality, high-value care.

SETTING GOALS

Patients enter the Swedish system at various stages of need. And while patients expect — and get — great care, the Quality & Value Department strives to exceed those expectations in two concrete ways.

One way is to ensure that SMG clinical teams are able to do the right thing for patients, every time. By empowering caregivers with processes based on proven best practices and decreasing variation in workflows, patients will experience more consistent, high-quality care.

Another way is to decrease innovation cycle time. This means overcoming the lag time between the announcement of breakthrough, proven therapies and their adoption by healthcare organizations. By some estimates, 15 years or more may elapse between proof that a new treatment is effective and its widespread diffusion. Reducing that cycle time is essential so that patients have access to the most current, proven medical treatments when they need them.

BUILDING A FOUNDATION

The Quality & Value Department made significant progress in 2013 and became an integral part of SMG operations in the following ways:

Governance

The Quality & Value Subcommittee aligns directly under the Physician Executive Council's Care Transformation Committee. Value in healthcare means "patient-centered outcome" divided by "cost-to-produce" that outcome. Considering how to most efficiently deliver high-quality care to patients has been the subcommittee's central charge.

Metrics

- Care team metrics were developed that are relevant to clinic work and allow clinical and administrative leaders to understand and improve current care performance. For example, there now is a series of metrics that will measure the value of care produced in SMG's urgent care clinics.
- On DocSpot, SMG's online information portal, a metrics site request was created for Q&V, and the department's section expanded to allow self-serve access to metrics requests.
- Metrics were cataloged and organized for streamlined use across the Swedish system.

Preventive Health

- A plan was approved to implement all 18 United States Health Services Program priority preventive health recommendations for SMG adult patients.
- A successful preventive health program pilot was designed and implemented to ensure colon cancer screening compliance.

Strong for Surgery

The Quality & Value Department facilitated SMG's participation and leadership in Washington's statewide surgical quality improvement initiative Strong for Surgery. This program increases patient surgery readiness before hospital arrival.





SELECTIVE GROWTH

An important part of our primary care growth strategy includes reaching out to communities in need. We establish a presence in new areas, recruit providers who are a good fit for

neighborhoods, and offer true community-focused healthcare. In 2013, we welcomed two new practices:

SWEDISH CHILDREN'S CLINIC-EDMONDS

This clinic has been providing exceptional and personal pediatric care for children in Edmonds since the 1960s. Its five pediatricians and experienced staff joined the Swedish family in fall 2013 and now benefit from proximity to the Swedish Edmonds Birth & Family Clinic, which fosters a natural pairing of care from birth through adolescence.

SWEDISH BEACON HILL PRIMARY CARE

Swedish Beacon Hill Primary Care was founded by two physicians who grew up in the Beacon Hill neighborhood and made it their life's work to care for their neighbors. One physician has practiced there for 37 years, the other for 30. Some patients have been visiting the clinic since the day its doors opened. This clinic exemplifies how much we value the trust and confidence patients place in our care over time. We're looking forward to enhancing these strong ties to the Beacon Hill community.


- Twenty locations now have extended weekday hours. Some can see patients as early as 6:30 a.m., some as late as 8 p.m.

- Each market (Seattle, North End, Eastside) has at least one practice open on weekends.

CONNECTING WITH PATIENTS IN NEW WAYS

Swedish Medical Group's care teams create units similar to family — both immediate and extended. A close-knit group of care professionals attends to patients and their immediate needs, and an extended group of experts — such as nutritionists, pharmacists and physical therapists — manages other issues. This approach helps improve care quality, creates continuity of care and makes clinic workflows more efficient.

SMG officially introduced care teams in primary care clinics in 2013 after developing the concept over several years. The nucleus of the team includes:

- Physician or Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner (ARNP): Takes primary responsibility for a patient's medical needs.
- **Medical assistant or nurse:** Works directly with the physician or ARNP to perform routine tasks and procedures.
- Patient services coordinator: Manages paperwork and takes time after each appointment to share information and answer patient questions.

BUILDING FOR THE LONG TERM

The care team model was rolled out to 11 SMG primary care clinics in 2013. Eight more clinics will adopt the model in 2014. Care team rollout will continue throughout primary care and specialty care into 2015. To form care teams, clinic staff receive special training that reviews the impact of care teams and how different care team members' roles will fit into the model. In many cases, a physical redesign of clinic spaces also occurs to facilitate collaboration among care team members.

MEASURING SUCCESS

The implementation of care teams is part of a long-term plan to transform care within SMG. Already, both patients and staff report better patient experiences, deeper connections between patients and clinicians, and positive clinical outcomes. Additional care team benefits include reduced hospital readmissions/admissions and the ability to scale care teams to match a particular patient's medical complexity.

NURSING STANDARDS CONTINUE STEADY CLIMB

In 2013, Swedish Medical Group's Department of Nursing pushed to raise its already high standards by creating better collaboration and giving every nurse a voice. Significant progress was made toward development of an Ambulatory Nurse Residency Program, which will help train a new generation of nurses in this critical clinical skill.

Key nursing accomplishments included rolling out DocSpot to all SMG nurses and medical assistants and providing nurses with access to UpToDate, an evidence-based tool that standardizes nursing triage and education. The department implemented eQVR (electronic quality variance reporting), a big upgrade over paper reporting. In addition, the Department of Nursing built on its role in education and development of its clinical staff by offering support services for the Safety Department, Patient Relations, Health Information Management and SMG's medical-assistant float pool. And by providing Swedish nurses with a centralized contact system (dedicated email address and telephone line), the department improved clinical staff satisfaction.

In recognition of the Department of Nursing's high quality, SMG's nurse executive, Charlotte Foster, R.N., BSN, MHA, was appointed to the Washington state Nursing Care Quality Assurance Commission's legislative task force. There, her knowledge and influence is helping to shape healthcare throughout the state. Plus, four SMG registered nurses were nominated for the March of Dimes Nurse of the Year award in leadership and care categories.

2014 will see continued growth and development within SMG's nursing staff, building further alignment with physicians and making greater contributions to Swedish's goal of transforming healthcare.

TRANSITIONING FROM HOSPITAL TO HOME

The Residential Care Team (RCT) program at Swedish is designed to manage patients' transitions through the care continuum: from our hospitals, to nursing or rehabilitation centers, and then to their home and community physicians.

RCT's care professionals offer transitional care for patients who are well enough to leave the hospital but need time to heal and rest before returning home. Swedish's RCT provides care at several skilled nursing facilities (SNFs) in the Puget Sound, where they offer great care for patients and make the transition from one care stage to the next as seamless and well-coordinated as possible.

Under the astute leadership of medical director Ric Troyer, M.D., since 2011, RCT has experienced significant growth and success. In February 2013, RCT cared for 568 patients. By December, that number had nearly doubled to 1,046. Physician performance and revenues similarly increased. RCT now is preparing for even more success in 2014. It will expand to provide "treatment in place" with Swedish medical personnel serving as primary care providers and managing patients within our Continuing Care Retirement

Communities (CCRC) partner sites. A pilot program will be launched for the assisted living resident population at Cristwood Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Shoreline, and further growth is anticipated through new partnerships with two to three additional CCRCs in the region.

RCT also is helping to transform cardiac care by working with Swedish hospital campuses and its partner SNFs to develop a program that will guide patients step-by-step through their cardiac procedures. This roadmap will be yet another way in which we're improving efficiency and providing valuable care information to our patients.





SWEDISH NEUROSCIENCE INSTITUTE

Swedish Neuroscience Institute (SNI) formed a collaborative relationship with Providence Medical Group (PMG) in 2013 to better coordinate services, share clinical best practices and keep world-class care close to home for patients. Together, the groups are creating a new organizational model and significantly building on existing telehealth initiatives.

PROGRAMS

SNI's model of Integrated Practice Units (IPUs) helps create specialized care programs for specific patient groups. In 2013, that model led to the development of the Complex Spine Center and the Deep Brain Stimulation and Neuromodulation Center, and the expansion of neurology services to Olympic Medical Center (OMC) in Port Angeles. Additionally, a second neurologist joined the team to fill demand for neurology services at our OMC partner facility in Sequim.

During 2013, SNI's inpatient programs also saw substantial growth. A planned neuro intensive care unit now operates at Swedish's Cherry Hill campus. The inpatient neurology team grew as well, and a brand new general neurology suite opened in Cherry Hill's James Tower in order to meet expanding patient volumes.

Finally, SNI became the first Swedish group to provide services within a Providence affiliate facility, specifically neurosurgery and Swedish TeleStroke System services at Providence Regional Medical Center Everett. This new affiliation, called the Northwest Neurosciences Alliance, combined Providence Medical Group and Swedish Medical Group physicians into one team and has expanded services and improved access to the Everett-area community.

SNI CARED FOR 10,280 NEW PATIENTS IN 2013

RESEARCH

The Ben and Catherine Ivy Center for Advanced Brain Tumor Treatment welcomed nationally renowned brain cancer expert and neurosurgeon, Charles Cobbs, M.D., who brought to Swedish a \$3 million-plus grant. And in 2014, another grant approval is anticipated for Dr. Cobbs — for more than \$2.5 million. This funding will be used as a collaborative study among the Ivy Center, the University of California at San Francisco and Harvard University.

2013 also was a year of significant research advances at SNI. Tara Benkers, M.D., joined the lvy Center faculty and launched eight new clinical trials. Stephen Monteith, M.D., introduced an MRI-guided Focused Ultrasound service and conducted research in treating tumors with ultrasound.

Overall, SNI had 93 active studies in 2013, including 30 new ones. Nearly 1,000 patients currently are participating in the studies.

EDUCATION

Education is an integral component of SNI's mission. In 2013, Swedish's Fellowship Program added a specific brain tumor fellowship, worked to develop an advanced ontology fellowship that will begin in 2014, and added expert neuroscience physicians to the faculty.

SNI also completed a second successful year of partnership with Madigan Army Medical Center, in which Madigan's neurology residents rotate through SNI services, and staff neurologists also serve as faculty for Madigan's annual mock board examinations.

PHILANTHROPIC SUPPORT

The Campaign for Swedish, led by the Swedish Foundation, concluded its seven-year run with major funding benefiting the Swedish Neuroscience Institute. SNI's medical directors partnered with the foundation to support philanthropic efforts, receiving specific training to help them in that work.

PITUITARY CENTER ACHIEVES MILESTONE

The Swedish Neuroscience Institute's Seattle Pituitary Center achieved a significant landmark in 2013: performing its 1,000th pituitary procedure since its inception in 2005. Under the guidance of Marc R. Mayberg, M.D., surgical director of the center and executive director of SNI, the center has grown into one of the largest such programs in the nation. **The program consistently performs the highest number of outpatient and pituitary surgeries across five states, with patients coming from Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana and Alaska.**

Patients partner with our nationally known pituitary experts in neurosurgery, neuroendocrinology and radiation oncology to receive medical treatments often not available elsewhere. The center also focuses on research and clinical trials that give those patients the most advanced and effective treatment options. And its ability to handle all patient needs in a single location leads to better care coordination and greater convenience for patients.

SWEDISH HEART & VASCULAR INSTITUTE

Swedish Medical Group's heart and vascular teams — cardiology, cardiac surgery and vascular surgery — made 2013 a year of collaboration and significant clinical accomplishment.

EXPANDED CARE

The Swedish Heart & Vascular Institute took big strides forward as physicians, clinical staff and leaders partnered to assess how best to give Swedish patients the most complete cardiac care across several campuses. With additional resources and a new coverage structure, our team of physicians, advanced practice physicians and hospitalists now provide around-the-clock cardiac care in a variety of ways for hospital and intensive care unit patients.

Other opportunities to streamline care came to fruition as a universal transfer protocol was developed that has reduced unnecessary transfers between campuses. And a new Access/Fast Track Clinic has organized the referral process and provided an access point for care.

Now, patients' cardiac-related visits can be triaged and facilitated quickly and efficiently, whether they are emergency or hospital discharge follow-up; same day, next day or walk-in; surgical clearance; or for urgent, non-invasive procedures.

Progress with our Swedish Health Network partners moved ahead, too. SHVI worked with Olympic Medical Center in Port Angeles on recruiting cardiology specialists and developing telehealth opportunities. Additionally, a statement of work was prepared for Jefferson Healthcare in Port Townsend that strategically will guide and revamp the cardiology program there.

EXCEPTIONAL GIVING

Ten SHVI physicians have given a combined \$315,000 toward The Campaign for Swedish, the largest fundraising campaign in Swedish history.


CLINICAL ADVANCEMENTS

Research, education and groundbreaking medical procedures have played a major role in SHVI's growth and progress in 2013.

- The Heart and Vascular research team is involved in more than 60 ongoing clinical trials.
- Team physicians authored 15 articles in 2013 that appeared in medical journals.
- SMG's medical director of Cardiac Surgery, Glenn Barnhart, M.D., was named cosponsor in the first U.S. clinical trial of a rapid deployment system for surgical aortic valve replacement (AVR) procedures.
- The Cardiac Surgery team performed more than 50 transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) cases, nearly doubling the 2012 pilot. This procedure helps patients who are not candidates for traditional open-heart surgery.
- After the Food and Drug Administration approved the MitralClip implant device for U.S.
 use, a Bellingham woman became the first patient at Swedish, the first in Washington
 state and one of the first in the country to receive it in November 2013. The clip helps a
 heart's malfunctioning mitral valve to close properly. Swedish now is an approved regional
 site for the procedure.

CLINICAL OUTCOMES

- Door-to-balloon time is a measure of the speed of heart attack treatment and a major predictor of heart attack survival. Swedish is a national leader in this important metric, ranking in the top 10 percent of hospitals nationwide.
- Swedish also ranks in the top 20 percent of all U.S. hospitals on mortality prevention in percutaneous coronary intervention (nonsurgical) procedures, such as angioplasties.

NATIONAL RATING

SHVI's Cardiac Surgery team achieved a national accomplishment in 2013: It became one of 23 hospitals, out of 998 considered, to receive a three-star rating for cardiac surgery from the Society of Thoracic Surgeons. The rating, based on clinical outcomes for coronary artery bypass graft (CABG) and aortic valve replacement, is a testament to the skill and expertise of the Swedish cardiac team.

SWEDISH MUSCULOSKELETAL SERVICES

Keeping people moving and active is the goal of the highly regarded Swedish Spine, Sports & Musculoskeletal Medicine group, comprising care providers with specialty training in the non-surgical management of musculoskeletal disorders.

What began in 2012 as a new line of care for Swedish Medical Group evolved during 2013 into a fast-growing, dynamic clinical group with a vision of becoming an invaluable service both for Swedish and for the region's patients. Led by Andy Cole, M.D., **Swedish Musculoskeletal Services focuses on six clinical components: wellness, spine, sports, peripheral joint, occupational medicine and inflammatory disorders.** It has become one of Swedish's major service lines, linking all musculoskeletal services within the system.

CLINICAL PATHWAYS

Swedish Musculoskeletal Services has pioneered a standardized process for creating clinical pathways that can be duplicated and used throughout Swedish. During 2013, the musculoskeletal team developed three symptom-based

care pathways — lower back, hip and knee — with accompanying metrics and educational materials. These pathways were introduced to a select group of primary care providers for trial. The next step is full implementation across Swedish. Five more pathways will be completed in 2014: neck/midback, shoulder, elbow, hand/wrist and ankle/foot.

Creating these pathways requires extensive collaboration with Swedish colleagues, affiliates and partner healthcare groups. And this collaboration between clinicians and administration represents a landmark approach for the entire organization.

CHIROPRACTIC PILOT PROJECT

Swedish's new Chiropractic Pilot Project aims to create a collaborative model for patient care and align Swedish with community care providers in a way that supports referrals to Swedish. The pilot launched early in 2013 and includes 20 chiropractors in regions from Everett, through Redmond and Bellevue, to as far south and east as North Bend. Pilot members meet monthly to develop standard methods of reporting patient encounters and care, a common treatment pathway so that Swedish providers understand how patients are cared for in chiropractic offices, and methods for documenting results.

Statistics gathered from the pilot show an increase in patient volume to Swedish for specialty services and medical opinions. In 2014, the Chiropractic Pilot Project will work to further integrate chiropractic care into musculoskeletal services, foster closer treatment ties to physical therapists and others, and collect data that reflects patient outcomes and helps develop best-practices tools.

OB/GYN

The trust expectant parents place in Swedish was reflected in the record number of babies delivered in 2013. Across four Swedish hospitals, 9,014 births were recorded — that's one baby every 58 minutes! Both Swedish/Ballard (1,022 births) and Swedish/Issaquah (1,149) set facility records.

NEW SERVICES OPEN

Swedish services kept pace with demand as a Level II nursery, which cares for premature and ill babies — born as early as 34 weeks gestational — opened in July 2013 at our Issaquah campus. Also in July, the Lytle Center for Pregnancy & Newborns at Swedish/First Hill opened. In this warm, welcoming new facility, parents can take classes, get the support they need for their changing family needs, receive lactation assistance and benefit from new-mom and well-baby exams shortly after birth.

MIDWIFERY PROGRAM EXPANDS

Another reason Swedish is so appealing to soon-to-be parents is its growing midwifery program, which offers care for women before, during and after childbirth. Seven midwives are located at the Swedish/Ballard campus. All of them are advanced registered nurse practitioners with further professional training and accreditation from the American College of Nurse-Midwives. During 2013, Swedish/Issaquah also began adding midwives to build the foundation of a midwifery program on the Eastside, a process that will continue in 2014.

Across Swedish's OB/GYN services, 2013 saw the launch of a systemwide strategic planning process designed to build closer coordination and integration between Swedish's OB/GYN care sites. This development is an important step toward streamlined patient care.

HOSPITAL MEDICINE/CRITICAL CARE

Swedish Medical Group significantly expanded its Hospital Medicine and Critical Care teams in 2013. These specialists (hospitalists and intensivists) care exclusively for patients at Swedish hospitals and in intensive care units 24/7. They are specifically trained to provide coordinated care in a hospital setting.

IN OUR HOSPITALS

Hospitalist roles are varied — they serve as medical consultants to surgeons and other specialists, connect appropriate hospital subspecialists and care management staff with patients, conduct family conferences about care and also respond rapidly to changing patient conditions or a medical crisis.

• Fifteen Swedish Edmonds hospitalists joined SMG's Hospital Medicine, bringing the team total to more than 70.

IN OUR INTENSIVE CARE UNITS

The growing Critical Care program is redefining the intensive care unit model of care, delivering real results in quality and establishing performance management and governance. The team:

- Tripled daytime coverage and added dedicated nighttime coverage in intensive care units across Swedish hospital campuses.
- Added care for cardiac and neurological patients at Swedish/Cherry Hill.
- Launched a neurointensivist program.
- Led an 80 percent reduction in ventilator-associated pneumonia (VAP), a 17 percent reduction in catheter-associated urinary tract infections (CAUTI), and a 14 percent reduction in central line-associated bloodstream infections (CLABSI), all compared to 2012 data.
- Collaborated with parent company Providence Health & Services to standardize staffing models, TelelCU and outreach, and quality measurement and reporting.


PALLIATIVE CARE

The Palliative Care team created a system-wide Steering Committee in 2013 to integrate and expand palliative care services at all levels of care needed from ambulatory to critical care. A medical director leads the program in partnership with Swedish Cancer Institute and Swedish Neurosciences Institute.

Palliative medicine is the medical specialty that focuses on relief of pain and other challenging symptoms of serious illness. This service is appropriate at any stage of a serious, chronic or life-threatening illness, and is not dependent on prognosis. A multidisciplinary and collaborative care team from medicine, nursing, social work and spiritual care work closely with patients and families to discuss care goals and options, and foster shared decision-making. Goals include maximizing comfort and offering the best possible quality of life to patients and their families. Palliative Care is available at the Swedish First Hill and Cherry Hill campuses, with expansion plans in the coming year for the Ballard and Issaguah campuses.

A robust plan is under way to educate Swedish physicians and caregivers about palliative care and how these services improve patient satisfaction, care coordination across multiple healthcare disciplines and settings, and clinical outcomes.

EXPANDING CARE OPTIONS TO COMMUNITIES


As we work to transform care delivery in our communities of all sizes, telehealth becomes even more integral. These programs use secure video connections, high-definition imaging and other sophisticated technologies to allow specialists at Swedish to diagnose and propose treatment options for patients who are not sitting in the same exam room, hospital room or emergency department as the Swedish physician.

In both urban and rural areas of Washington, transportation issues and physician shortages pose significant challenges for patients who require specialized care. Here's how telehealth helps:

- Assures patients access to care when they need it and when time is critical for diagnosing and treating serious conditions.
- Allows specialist physicians to practice more efficiently while supporting communities that don't have specialty care available locally.
- Reduces the amount of travel for both physicians and patients.

Ten years ago, Swedish launched TelelCU to become the first hospital in Washington — and one of a handful of hospitals nationwide — to harness technology in order to improve access to specialized care. Three years later, Acute Telestroke debuted and brought the expertise of Swedish Neuroscience Institute to stroke patients in communities throughout Washington and the Pacific Northwest. Since then, Swedish has continued to add to its telehealth services and its network of hospitals, emergency departments and medical practices.

PROVIDER SERVICES

Recruiting the right people to Swedish Medical Group is essential to the way we're transforming care delivery. We look for physicians and advanced practice clinicians who are team-oriented and deeply patient-centered. When we find the right fit, everybody gains — our patients, our medical teams and support staff, and the communities we serve. To meet the diverse health conditions of our patients in 2013, the recruiting team brought 191 new faces to SMG. Of those, 54 were primary care providers.

MEANINGFUL USE

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) offers financial incentives for the effective use, termed "meaningful use," of electronic health records (EHR). In just a few short years, Swedish is a top Meaningful Use performer.

The program continued to both achieve new milestones and expand its reach throughout 2013:

- Registered 100 percent of eligible Swedish providers for Meaningful Use certification, compared to an 80 percent national benchmark.
- Increased eligible provider passing rate to 99 percent from 85 percent in 2012
- Continued submitting data to Washington State Department of Health to aid public health monitoring for disease outbreaks and illness patterns.
- Used MyChart patient portal to send patients alerts about overdue visits, needed tests of follow-up appointments.
- Developed workflow for Meaningful Use Stage 2 requirements.

Staying ahead of changes to Meaningful Use is integral to Swedish's success. Meaningful Use enters Stage 2 in 2014, with higher compliance thresholds, such as interoperability between disparate EHR systems. The new incentives are based on now using EHRs to zero in on preventive care and improve patient engagement.

BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

The Business Development team uses data and critical market information to guide strategic decisions for Swedish Medical Group to support physicians and their practices across primary care and specialty care. In 2013, SMG implemented a customer relationship management platform (CRM). With this system, the Business Development team can more closely collaborate and purposefully track and report activities. CRM directly ties into the marketing analysis tool for service line planning, which allows the team to network across service lines and find ways to connect physicians and their services.
